2. What skills & characteristics do you think are important for an effective teacher? Which of these skills & characteristics do you possess and how will you develop them at the Ranch?
3. Identify an important leadership training or team building strategy. How was this important to you in your life, and why would you like to pass it on to younger teen leaders?
